The Challenge of Living by Faith



What's your favorite song? I can never answer that question! As a music education major at Sam Houston State (Go Bearkats) I encountered thousands of years of instrumental music from ancient drums, flutes, and lyres to harpsichord, piano, symphony, band, that included styles like concertos, sonatas, symphonies, chamber, not to mention some of my favorite jazz styles like big band, New Orleans, swing, improvisation, etc.

With streaming services, we have access to every style of popular vocal music available: pop, rock, rap, jazz, blues, folk, heavy metal, and of course country.

Back to the original question: it all depends on what I need from music at any given time. Last week after my uncle Bobby died, I needed to listen to some Joni Mitchell. In fact, the one that resonated with me most was "Both Sides Now." It was a featured song in the movie "Coda" about a hearing daughter and her deaf family.

It's easy to get caught up in one style of music because it's familiar: our friends, family, and neighbors listen to it, or it connects us to a time and/or place that brings us peace and comfort. But didn't Jesus challenge the insiders?

One of the things I've learned from my 5+ year spiritual journey through heart failure (it sounds worse than it is) is that my role was to give my heart/body (or not give it) what it needed or didn't need to do its job the best it could. For me, that was a three-prong path: diet, exercise, mental/spiritual. I want to focus on exercise for the moment.

After four days of complete inactivity, a hospital staff member came into my room and suggested that I sit up on the edge of the bed. Next was walking to the bathroom. Next was walking to the door and back, to the end of the hallway and back, around the nurses' station and back. When I was released from the hospital I went immediately to the gym (I wanted someone around if something went wrong) and walked the treadmill. From walking to interval walk/run to bike riding...at my last cardiologist appointment I was told that I had done it. My heart was back to the strength I had before the atrial fibrillation and atrial flutter weakened it to less than 20% (Ejection Fraction is the technical name for it)

My point is that for almost 5 years I was engaged in a balancing act: don't push too hard but push hard enough. Can we do this with our faith life? How do we push our self when it comes to "growing in faith, love, and obedience to God's will" which is what we promised to do at our confirmation/ affirmation of baptism when we took responsibility for our faith life.

Can we use Lent as a time to challenge our faith lives? What does that look like? Recently Jesus laid out a plan for his disciples: repent, believe, follow! Repent of our attachment to a worldly way of thinking based on the things we can see; believe that Jesus came to bring heaven to earth and follow his way of being in the world. Lent is meant for a time of transformation, not just giving up candy or soft drinks. Let us allow the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus transform our lives. It's not always easy; but it will be worth it.

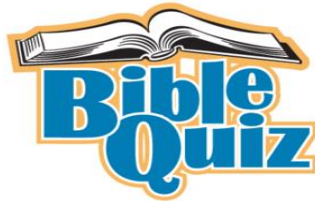

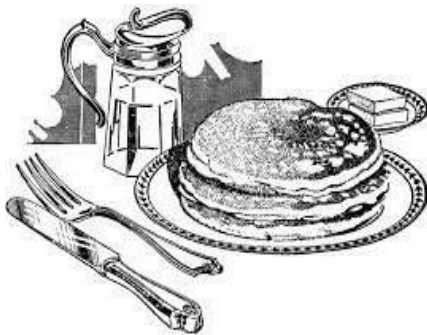

With January's freeze and endless rains, we're all looking forward to a better February, because surely the weather can't get any colder or wetter.

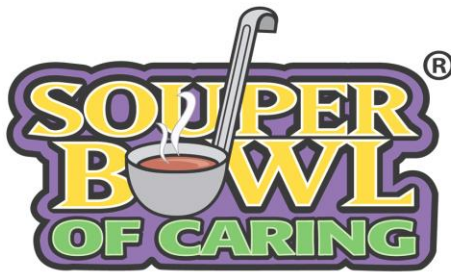
