## Talking and Talking and Talking and...

No news is good news. I wonder how many of us operate by that standard? The world is made up of talkers and listeners and everything in between. Many are surprised when I mention that I'm an introvert. Being an introvert or extrovert is about where we draw our energy. No matter how engaging a conversation is, I draw energy when I'm not engaged. I'm an ambivert: one who displays tendencies of both introversion and extraversion. It's a reminder that the elementary school phrase, "don't

judge a book by it's cover", is often a helpful mode of operation.

I believe that Jesus might have been an ambivert. He often went away to a quiet place to pray. But he also spent a lot of time talking. He talked to his disciples. He talked to ordinary people. He talked to the excluded. He talked to the elites. He talked to family, friends, enemies, lonely, rejected, hated, despised, condemned...he talked to all those who were considered poor, whether financially or spiritually.

It seems to me that a lack of talking especially about certain topics does more harm than good. Just this morning there was a discussion about our worship streaming issues. One expert said it was one thing and another expert said it was something else. When the two experts finally spoke with each other, they were able to agree on the actual problem. My point isn't to blame but to acknowledge the importance of talking.

The two men in a recent Gospel lesson were talking with each other on the road to Emmaus. As they talked they began to understand and believe that Jesus was the Messiah. When they invited Jesus to stay for a while "(W)hen he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him..."

Matthew 18 suggests that it's also important to whom we talk. Even though this passage refers specifically to sin much misunderstanding, struggle, and sometimes pain happens when we talk about others rather than talk to/with others.

A final illustration on a global scale: this past week was the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement when Protestants and Catholics gave up violence against one another. Over a span of 30 years more than 3500 mostly civilians died in violence over who's way of governing was right. For 5 years American George Mitchell talked...three separate sets of peace talks with people on all sides of the conflict speaking to one another, not about each other. One political leader said "(H)e listened us to agreement."

How we talk! To whom we talk! Most importantly that we continue to talk to one another. It's not talking for the sake of hearing ourselves talk, but for meaningful talking and listening that leads to action. Talk less about one another (to a third party) and more with one another, friends and enemies alike, people who think and act similarly and people who think and act differently. The Road to Emmaus story tells us that it can lead to our eyes being opened.


