## *From The Interim Pastor's Desk*

---

### Christmas at the North Platte Stockyard

As a child I would watch the cartoon Christmas specials-A Charlie Brown, Frosty, Rudolph-and each one of them had snow as a prominent part of the story; and “I’m Dreaming of a White Christmas” always gave me high hopes. But in Texas that’s not a likely occurrence. In Nebraska...maybe?

One year after the 11:00 candlelight worship at First Evangelical Lutheran Church in North Platte, Nebraska, for some reason unknown to me at the time, I decided to drive a few miles outside of town to get away from the city lights and gaze at the full moon “on the breast of the new-fallen snow” as it “[G]ave the lustre of mid-day to objects below...”

There I found myself, if for just a few minutes, in the quietest, most peaceful setting among the cows of a nearby feed lot, and became transported to a night many years ago that I imagine Mary and Joseph experienced as peace was born into a troubled, angry, chaotic, and unwelcoming world. The world had no room for a peace that surpasses all human understanding and yet God came anyway.

As Frederick Buechner says “...Yet for all our efforts, we've never quite managed to ruin” the most important yet most elementary and simple reality of the incarnation of God, the Word become flesh, Immanuel, God with us. Through commercialism that begins earlier and earlier every year and party after party until we drop, God enters, becomes one of us and one with us!

Where we may be most tempted to become conformed to this world (Rom. 12:2) happens the day after Christmas when everything “goes back to normal.” Decorations sometimes come down, Carols stop, Champaign, fireworks, end of year sales, and back to work as if nothing happened. We can be so worn out from the Holiday Spirit that we just return to our “normal routine.”

But is that what God hoped for by sending his son? We proclaim that the birth of Jesus changed the world forever. Jesus changed the image of God forever! God’s justice is not human justice (restorative rather than retributive); Jesus changed the way humans were view, especially women and children; Jesus changed the way we view enemies (love your enemies, pray for those who hurt you); modern science was heavily influenced by followers of Jesus; Jesus changed individual lives and still does today.

Jesus changed everything! “He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church (Martin Luther). And as much as it has become a part of our daily lives, forgiveness of sins became accessible to all who believe.

Today God continuously calls, sometimes with a whisper, sometimes with a clap of thunder or earth quake, ‘whom shall I send?’ Are we awake? Are we listening? Are we prepared? Are we connected to the courage God gives us to boldly, confidently, graciously, willingly, respond: ‘Here am I, send me’?

Texan and researcher Brene Brown ends her podcasts with the phrase “stay awkward, brave, and kind.” My ‘New Year’ Blessing for all of us is that the love that came down at Christmas lead us into the wilderness of temptation where awkward new experiences await: to sit with others as they share their truth beside the well of living water, to love our neighbor as ourself, to be an instrument through which God casts out fear and doubt, and to live in the already but not yet of God making all things new!

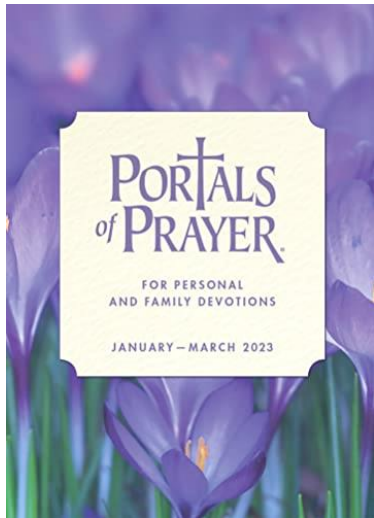
